## SPECIAL RECOGNITION

- § Presented the Gold Medal "Fighting Spirit Award" by Yohei Sasakawa of Japan's Nippon Foundation on October 30, 1997, at the United Nations in New York City. Award signifies advocacy on behalf of persons with disabilities, in particular Hansen's Disease.
- § Awarded the "Etem Utku Medal" by the University of Istanbul Medical School in Istanbul, Turkey. The award was in honor of Dr. Utku's excellent work as a leprologist and presented for "outstanding work in the field of leprosy." The award was presented on January 31, 2000 in conjunction with World Leprosy Day.
- § Co-recipient of the "Raoul Follereau Award" presented to IDEA by AIFO (International Association for Friends of Raoul Follereau) for "Courageous work in impacting change in the field of leprosy....". The award was presented at the Villa Pulavicini in Bologna, Italy on May 28, 2000.
- § Invited by the World Health Organization's (WHO) Special Ambassador on the Elimination of Leprosy to address the United Nations' International Commission on Human Rights on August 4, 2003 in Geneva, Switzerland. This first of its kind presentation was jointly made with four other persons from the USA, Ethiopia, India and Philippines.
- § Presented the Mayor of Houston's Disability Advocate of the Year Award on October 19, 2004. The award was for advocacy done on behalf of persons affected by Hansen's disease, as well as those with mental/cognitive disabilities.
- § Invited by the Friends of Fontilles, an international anti-leprosy organization, to address the national press corps of Spain in Madrid on January 25, 2005 in conjunction with World Leprosy Day. This marked the first time that a person affected by leprosy had been invited to present at this annual event.

§ Completed 30 of 200 interviews on persons affected by leprosy in Spain, U.S., and Ukraine under an Oral Histories Grant awarded to IDEA by Oxford University.

§ Invited by WHO to make a presentation on stigma to experts in the field of leprosy in Cairo, Egypt on March 7, 2008.

§ Awarded the "Americanism Award" on September 5, 2008 in Orlando, Florida at the national convention of the 40&8. The award is for exhibiting an ability to overcome challenges.

The first event was designed to address the loss of natural support systems for residents at the only Hansen's Disease Center in the continental U.S.
